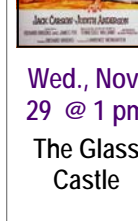

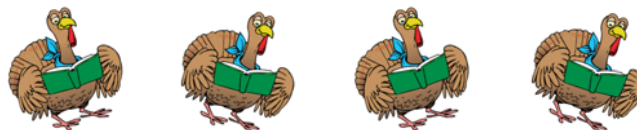


Summer Reading Winners!
