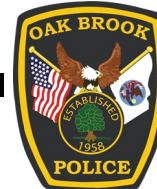

On December 29, 2019 at 11:50 A.M., a subject approached a woman in her vehicle at Oakbrook Mall and told her to give him her car and brandished a knife. The woman fled but the subject could not start the vehicle, since he did not have the keys. The subject then approached a valet parking attendant and entered a running vehicle and drove away. The subject was later apprehended in Chicago and arrested for Aggravated Vehicular Hijacking, Armed Violence and Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle and is being held on a \$500,000 bond at the DuPage County Jail.
